Instructions to Schools

Each school presenting candidates for Computer Studies (451) in the KCSE examination should produce two copies of these instructions. One copy will be for the Headteacher and the other one for the teacher in charge of the Computer Studies examination project hereafter referred to as the Computer Studies Teacher.

The headteacher and the Computer Studies teacher should each read these instructions carefully. Relevant information should then be conveyed to the candidates as soon as possible to enable them to carry out the project in good time.

There is only one project. The title of the project is "MWANZO BARAKA MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM". It is necessary for the Computer Studies Teacher to discuss the project with the candidates and the Headteacher so as to understand what is required.

PROJECT TITLE: MWANZO BARAKA MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM

- 1. A school presenting candidates for computer studies shall be required to provide each candidate with the following:
 - (a) A working computer system:

Each candidate will require access to a computer. The computer should be capable of running a Database Management System and a word processor.

(b) A working printer:

The candidate will require a printer to produce drafts and the final printouts of the project work.

(c) Removable storage medium

The candidate is required to store the finished project work in the removable storage medium. This will be handed in together with the printouts to the Headteacher.

- 2. After the candidates have been provided with the facilities outlined in (1) above, they should be instructed to keep a record of the activities carried out and any other observations made. The records will be used by the candidates to write their final report.
- 3. The project should be carried out by candidates between the months of **March** and **September**.
- 4. The marking scheme will be sent to schools at the beginning of September. The computer studies teacher should accurately assess the candidates' projects using the marking scheme provided.
- 5. The total score for each candidate shall be transferred from the assessment card to the manual marksheet. The list in the manual marksheet should be in an **ascending order of index numbers**.
- 6. It is the responsibility of the headteacher to ensure that candidates' projects are marked and the marks are correctly entered in the manual marksheets. The report printouts, the softcopies, the manual marksheets and the report by the headteacher should be sent to the Kenya National Examinations Council through the Sub-County Examinations Officer before the end of the first week of the month of October.

- (e) Candidates should answer the questions in English.

MWANZO BARAKA MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM

Mwanzo Baraka organisation is a self help group intended to improve the economic status of its members through pooling of financial resources. The organisation sustains itself through registration fees of its members, monthly contributions, interest accrued through loans given to members, and penalties for delayed payments. The members benefit by getting cheap loans from the organisation.

Membership to the organisation is by registration. There are two types of membership; individual and group. Group membership constitutes two or more individuals who have common interests. An individual member pays a registration fee of Kshs. 2,000 while a group pays Kshs. 5,000. During the registration of individuals, personal details are captured. When registering a group, details of the group and those of its individual members are captured.

An individual member contributes a monthly share of not less than Kshs. 1,000 to the organisation. For those registered under a group, each member contributes a monthly share of not less than Kshs. 1,000 where Kshs. 200 is the group share contribution by the member. All monthly contributions are treated as shares for the contributor and attract annual dividends.

Members can borrow loans from the organisation based on their total shares. Members registered as individuals can be loaned up to three times their share contribution. The repayment period does not exceed three years and the loan attracts interest at a rate of 1.2% per month on the principal amount borrowed. Members registered under a group can be loaned up to four times their individual share contribution. The repayment period does not exceed four years and the loan attracts an interest at a rate of 1% per month on the principal amount borrowed. A group can also get a group loan, amounting to three times the group's total share contribution which attracts interest at a rate of 0.8% per month payable within five years. All payments to the organisation are monthly and must be made by the last day of the month. Any defaulted payments are penalised at a rate of 10% per month.

Every end of the year, the organisation determines the total interest charged on all loans and total penalties on defaulted amounts. 60% of this amount is paid as dividends to the shareholders each getting an amount proportional to their total share contributions. The balance is retained to run the organisation.



Design a computerised database system with its documentation for the Mwanzo Baraka organisation that should be able to:

- 1. Maintain records of members and groups.
- 2. Maintain records of registration fees.
- 3. Maintain records of monthly contributions.
- 4. Maintain records of loan borrowed.
- 5. Compute loan repayments and interest.
- 6. Compute income for the organisation.
- 7. Compute dividends to each shareholder.
- 8. Generate reports on demand.
